NATIONAL DISASTER MANAGEMENT ACT ALERT LEVEL 3 REGULATIONS

Dear Stakeholder/Licence Holder

Please see the following information relevant to liquor licenced establishments from the National Disaster Management Act Regulations under Adjusted Alert Level 3, announced by President Ramaphosa on 15 June 2021, please also see herein attached regulations.

These herein attached regulations commenced at 00H01, 16 June 2021.

- 1 Curfew is from 22H00 until 04H00 daily
- 2 Closing time for restaurants, taverns and pubs is 21H00
- 3 The sale of liquor for off-consumption is only permitted from 10H00 to 18H00, from Mondays to Thursdays, excluding Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays (this does not apply to wine farms, micro-manufacturers and micro-distilleries)
- 4 On-consumption sales are permitted, subject to strict adherence to the curfew
- 5 Transportation of liquor is permitted
- 6 Registered wineries, wine farms, micro-breweries, micro-distilleries and other similar establishments registered as micro-manufacturers may continue to operate in offering wine tasting and sales for off-consumption purposes to the public, subject to strict adherence to the curfew, social distancing and health protocols)

Activities associated with night clubs, such as, dancing to loud music and failing to adhere to social distancing are prohibited

Wearing of face masks is mandatory in a public place or when entering any premises

9

All employees must wear a face mask while performing their duties

10

Every liquor licenced premises must provide sanitisers at the entrance and implement social distancing of at least 1.5m

11

Gatherings at all liquor licenced premises are subject to a maximum of 50 persons or less for indoor venues and 100 persons or less for outdoor venues

Ensure that all patrons inside the venue observe a distance of 1.5m from each other, are adhering to all health protocols and wearing of masks
